ORDINANCE NO. 2018-001

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING BLUFF CITY MUNICIPAL CODE
TITLE 18-114 DEALING WITH RECONNECTION CHARGES**

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen deem it necessary to adjust the reconnection charges for service.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND
ALDERMAN OF THE TOWN OF BLUFF CITY, TENNESSEE:**

1. That 18-114 of the Bluff City Municipal Code shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following language:

18-114. Reconnection Charge. Whenever service has been discontinued as provided above, a reconnection charge of \$25 shall be collected by the Town before service is restored.

2. That any ordinances in conflict herewith shall be repealed and any ordinances not in conflict with this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

3. This ordinance shall become effective from and after its final passage the public welfare requiring it.
